## Notable Tree Program



The City of Bradenton Tree and Land Preservation Board is seeking nominations of notable trees within its city limits. Recipients will be announced on National Arbor Day, the last Friday in April. Photographs of the notable trees will be mounted on a Tree City U.S.A. wall at Bradenton City Hall that showcases its special trees as a matter of civic pride.

The Notable Tree Program highlights trees having qualities that mature trees can achieve in our climate and soil. Trees eligible for recognition are:

- An individual mature tree
- Groups of mature trees forming a recognizable unit
- Two or more continuous blocks of mature street trees

Notable trees exhibit health and beauty, historical value or character.

- Health and beauty of a tree include size, overall shape, condition of leaf, frond or needle, and flowering appearance.
- A historical tree might be one beneath which something significant happened or that is verifiably ancient.
- A tree of character could be one that has dodged an obstacle and grew around it.

Citizens are welcome to nominate notable trees within Bradenton's city limits by submitting a recent color photograph along with attached form completed with name, address, phone number, tree type, tree location time of year the tree looks best and reason for nomination. Photographs will not be returned. Entries must be postmarked by November 30 each year.
